2 Call to order at 7:04 p.m.

4 Bill Calihan: So welcome everybody. Thanks  
5 again for coming out to the second booster club meeting  
6 of the year for the ROTC and our cadets here. First, I  
7 just want to say thank you to the Davis family, again I  
8 mentioned it, providing the refreshments so sorry we  
9 couldn't catch you at home and or online watch us at a  
10 later time frame. Stop in and see us and partake at  
11 some point in the school year, hopefully, and again back  
12 by popular demand, we have the door prize so hopefully  
13 everybody's signed in. There will be some, a drawing  
14 that Cadet Rachow will take us through. But I would  
15 like to start, as it was well received this year by the  
16 first meeting, the Pledge of Allegiance so if everyone  
17 could join me in standing. Please jump in after I get  
18 this started.

19 (Pledge of Allegiance was recited.)

20 Bill Calihan: All right. So now that we're  
21 into the second board meeting, we do have our meeting  
22 minutes from the previous month. We were not able to  
23 get a copy to all of you today, but we will. That will  
24 be the regular order of business as the year proceeds.  
25 We will have the minutes posted to the Weebly, as well.

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1 We met together previously on September 19th and some of  
2 the highlights from there I went over the absence of our  
3 Treasurer Larry Rachow. I went over the Treasurer's  
4 report, highlighting a few of the items that were in  
5 there. That report was also passed out at the booster  
6 club meeting there and the income and expenses were  
7 addressed. There were only a few that month.

8 Special events and fundraising: This was  
9 taken by Jaremy Davis to my left here, our fundraising  
10 chair and also Sergeant Master Quintana. The first  
11 special event we had was Friday, September 22. Many of  
12 your cadets had been in the ropes course and then we  
13 also did the, we were getting ready for our fall  
14 fundraiser for the candy bars and then we had also the  
15 homecoming concessions.

16 The old business from the 19th of September  
17 was that the bylaws for the booster club, so for the  
18 Board up here, but then also all of you as making the,  
19 completing the booster club those are posted and linked  
20 on the Weebly for your information. And then in new  
21 business, the main part of our new business was going  
22 through the year, calendar, just trying to help promote  
23 all the areas where you can get plugged in with the, as  
24 the booster club to come alongside the classroom, hel  
25 either to raise money or support at events where

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1 supervision or just support is let's say needed. Okay.  
2 And then we had an open discussion that kind of  
3 addressed how the overall function and finances worked  
4 and we adjourned around 1940.

5 Any comments or anything needed to be added?

6 Okay. All right.

7 (No response.)

8 Bill Calihan: Then can we go for a vote to  
9 close those and post them?

10 Wendy Chunn: Yes. Bill.

11 Bill Calihan: Approve.

12 Wendy Chunn: Jaremy.

13 Jaremy Davis: Yes, approved.

14 Wendy Chunn: Larry.

15 Larry Rachow: Approved.

16 Wendy Chunn: And, Wendy. I approve.

17 Bill Calihan: All right. Thank you.

18 So moving on for the month of October now  
19 with September closed out. We're going to start with  
20 the Treasurer's report. Should have all had a chance to  
21 grab a handout on the way in.

22 Larry Rachow: Closing out September  
23 starting out the year, not much coming on the revenue  
24 side. We're still pretty strong at just over \$17,000 in  
25 the account. So as you can see there's really no

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1 revenue coming in for the month of September. I know we  
2 talked about homecoming, but that was in October so  
3 we'll record that next month. Towards the end I'll give  
4 a little summary of that, the original numbers coming  
5 in. Then if we flip over to the expenses. If we, a lot  
6 of the set up, the cadets with their uniform were in  
7 there. The big thing that Bill said earlier, the ropes  
8 course, the field trip, all the expenses for food and  
9 drink for the cadets.

10 Other than that, just got a couple pending  
11 items, one from last year, one of the scholarships and a  
12 couple of the supplies and uniform alterations. Then  
13 hitting on the homecoming, roughly, if you look at it  
14 we've got the reimbursement from the school of \$2,000.  
15 The concession sales were just over \$300 and then we  
16 spent about \$1,200 in concessions to support that so we  
17 made about \$1,300 in concessions, but the true numbers  
18 will come out once everything starts to clear for next  
19 year -- next month, not next year. Thank you.

20 Bill Calihan: Any questions?

21 (No verbal response.)

22 Bill Calihan: We'll go over to Jaremy for  
23 the fundraising reports.

24 Jaremy Davis: All right. So like Larry had  
25 mentioned, we had had the homecoming concessions and

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1 we'll have the final numbers for everybody at next  
2 month's meeting or actually, probably at December's  
3 meeting to be honest because we're not going to have any  
4 numbers for the pot luck. Because we got the pot luck  
5 in November and we'll go through that. We did so  
6 appreciate everybody that helped out with the homecoming  
7 concessions. It actually is pretty fun working with the  
8 kids and stuff too so if you guys have a chance to help  
9 out with concessions, do it because you can have a lot  
10 of fun. It's not as stressful and strenuous, the kids,  
11 the cadets do a wonderful job at really assisting and  
12 helping out and doing the running and a lot of the heavy  
13 lifting and so I just got a chance to, when I was there  
14 helping to, you know, mess with the kids a little bit.  
15 So, you know, that's always fun. I appreciate all the  
16 parents that helped out and volunteered for that.

17           The candy bars, as of yesterday, we had 35  
18 boxes that were left so we have a few less than that  
19 today.

20           SMSgt Quintana: About a dozen left.

21           Jaremy Davis: About a dozen left? So there  
22 you go.

23           Bill Calihan: What did we start with?

24           SMSgt Quintana: 162. This year is going  
25 really, really well. Really quick.

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1                   Jaremy Davis: So the candy bar sales are  
2 going very well. Right? I know. You ain't kidding.  
3 The wafer ones are phenomenal. So that's great and  
4 probably by tomorrow most of those will be out the door  
5 because the cadets will be picking them up. So we  
6 appreciate everybody that's eating candy and has bought  
7 and sold them. So thank you so much.

8                   Restaurants for the month for this fall.  
9 Last night we had the Pit Stop diner and thank you for  
10 everybody that had an opportunity or chance to get out.  
11 Did -- was anybody able to go out last night to the Pit  
12 Stop? Excellent. And how was everything? Good.

13                   I love Audra in the Pit Stop and I  
14 appreciate their willingness to help support us so if  
15 you guys get a chance, make sure you go there and tell  
16 her and the staff thanks for helping support us the next  
17 time you're in. They do a tremendous job and so I  
18 appreciate that.

19                   Next month, second Tuesday which is, I foget  
20 the day, Seeburger's Cheeseburgers. Todd, also a very  
21 awesome guy for the community, always willing to help  
22 out. That will be on the second Tuesday of November and  
23 on still finalizing the December, but I'll let everybody  
24 know, obviously, at the pot luck, that the December one  
25 is. But make sure that we also get out and support

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1 Seeburger's Cheeseburgers on the second Tuesday because,  
2 and the great thing about Todd, is some of these places  
3 like Texas Roadhouse, you got to make sure you have the  
4 flyer and you got to bring it in and you got to present  
5 it ahead of time and all that stuff. We appreciate  
6 everybody helping out. Todd makes it very easy. He  
7 doesn't even care if you come in and say JROTC, although  
8 it would be great if you did that way he knows who's  
9 coming in for that. Todd's just willing to donate to  
10 us, you know, based off of his sales and stuff for that  
11 day so make sure you get out and you support Seeburger's  
12 Cheeseburgers on the second Tuesday of November.

13 Bill Calihan: So do you have a conflict? I  
14 just realized, that's the 14th.

15 Booster Club Member: It's the booster club  
16 meeting. Is there a time frame?

17 Jaremy Davis: All day. All day long. So  
18 it's --

19 Bill Calihan: Go get your lunch, ROTC.

20 Jaremy Davis: Grab some dinner before you  
21 come and there you go.

22 Booster Club Member: Can we just bring the  
23 carry out and cheeseburgers and bring --

24 Bill Calihan: I'm coming to you're -- dish  
25 you're passing.

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1                   Booster Club Member: Carry out. Take it  
2 home. Come to the meeting.

3                   Jaremy Davis: Yeah, absolutely. If you  
4 guys, I don't know who hasn't been to Seeburger's  
5 Cheeseburgers? The most incredible onion rings that  
6 you'll ever have in your entire life. They're as big as  
7 your head. They're awesome. And, not to mention, the  
8 Fat Gratiot, which I really shouldn't eat any more, but  
9 the Fat Gratiot, the hamburger he's got is my favorite.  
10 So Seeburger's Cheeseburgers. Great place. Chicken  
11 sandwiches, chili, hamburgers. It's all fresh. So any  
12 ways, that's -- was there anything else I missed? I  
13 don't think so.

14                  Bill Calihan: No. Fantastic.

15                  Jaremy Davis: But I appreciate everybody's  
16 help and support. It really does help out and if  
17 anybody has, like I sad last month, if you have anybody,  
18 if anybody knows of a restaurant of the month or that  
19 might want to donate, I have talked to for this spring  
20 coming up, just so everybody knows, I did talk to  
21 Bubba's Barbecue and talked to Steve, from Bubba's  
22 Barbecue, he runs the food truck, has a food truck and  
23 so we're going to be working with him coming up this  
24 spring. I just talked to him the other day so I  
25 actually haven't filled anybody else in.



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1 Bill Calihan: Awesome.

2 Booster Club Member: Buffalo Wild Wings  
3 does them and I think Olive Garden -- not Olive Garden,  
4 Olga's does them, too.

5 Jaremy Davis: Oh, okay.

6 Booster Club Member: I've been to other  
7 ones for Anchor Bay.

8 Jaremy Davis: Excellent. I appreciate  
9 that. And BDubs did help us out by donating stuff to  
10 the raffle last year so they are a good place. I  
11 appreciate that.

12 Bill Calihan: Thank you. What was your  
13 name?

14 Stephanie: Stephanie.

15 Bill Calihan: Stephanie. Awesome. If you  
16 have also another idea or something like Stephanie, but  
17 you didn't think of it now, we try to keep it, all the  
18 ways to get in contact with us on the footer of the  
19 agenda when it comes in. There's a whole lot of  
20 information in there. Also, one thing that really helps  
21 me out, the something let's say you have a smart phone  
22 with a calendar on it, that bottom line, subscribe to  
23 our calendar. You can go into your phone calendar and  
24 subscribe to a, I guess it's called like a feed or  
25 something, but, basically, should be pretty straight

1 forward to do and you can get all the ROTC dates right  
2 there on your smart phone and see when those good  
3 restaurants of month that's coming up. So can at least  
4 plug that.

5           Jaremy Davis: And then if you guys ever are  
6 wondering, I always try, Senior Q. always puts, not to  
7 mention an event page for facebook for restaurant of the  
8 month and then and so you guys can share it, even if  
9 you're not able to make it, if you guys share it and you  
10 make it public when you share it that's great because  
11 that's more eyes that get to it. But then also if you,  
12 I also share it pretty heavily on mine and I always tag  
13 the JROTC in it so if you look up on facebook, the  
14 JROTC, Anchor Bay ROTC, you'll see a tag or whatever if  
15 you do a search on it and then you'll be able to see  
16 what the different restaurants of month and stuff are as  
17 well as we advertise.

18           Booster Club Member: I like that you do the  
19 event because it pops up on my phone, you forget.

20           Jaremy Davis: Agreed. So that's all I got.  
21 Sorry.

22           Bill Calihan: No, it's perfect. No  
23 worries. Good.

24           Next topic on our agenda is just the old  
25 business, just to kind of capture there was something.

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1 Basically, what we did last month was mainly review the  
2 yearly calendar and then really kind of playing out that  
3 theme, stepping into the new business, but we really  
4 want to be intentional about this year at the Booster  
5 Club meetings is just kind of letting you know, hey,  
6 what's coming up, event-wise and kind of getting into a  
7 little bit more detail. How you can get involved. How  
8 you can help out. What that also looks like and so  
9 we'll dive into that now and in the first part of the  
10 new business would be, in that same line, would be the  
11 drill meet concessions. We do have the home drill meet.  
12 It's coming up on November 4th and there's quite a bit  
13 of activity that's happening that day. A lot of it's  
14 covered through the classroom or the Board. One area  
15 that we definitely need booster club support on is in  
16 the concessions. So what we do is we partner with the  
17 sports boosters and we get access to the concession  
18 stand that's normally used when there's an event in the  
19 gym and then we kind of come in there. We have to put,  
20 let's say, put all their stuff away if anything is still  
21 left out and then we bring our own concession material  
22 in and we go ahead and use it, use that space to make  
23 coffee. We make hot water for Ramen. I'm pretty sure  
24 we cooked hot dogs last year and some other things. We  
25 talked about, we'll have to see how it works out in the

1 concession. Purchasing, but also maybe getting the  
2 popcorn going as well. So essentially what we're  
3 looking for is two booster club volunteers per time  
4 slot. We'll dive into what that looks like in just a  
5 moment, and then Senior Q. within the classroom, he will  
6 organize with the cadets, to ensure there's probably, I  
7 would say, three to four cadets that are helping to run  
8 orders between the side room and the front where the  
9 booster club members are taking the cash and working on  
10 the, we have, like, a machine for the credit cards and  
11 such. So it really helps out a lot in that regard.  
12 That's fun, like Jaremy said, getting a chance to kind  
13 of see the character and can-do attitude of the cadets  
14 in between the drill meets and whatnot. And then, yeah,  
15 we will have also booster club members, let's say, as  
16 well there, kind of floating as well as, so if you  
17 volunteer and you're like, wait a minute, my son or  
18 daughter is in a drill at this time, because I think a  
19 lot of the schedules come out very close to that time  
20 frame. I recall in the past years, working together to  
21 make sure that each parent was able to go and see their  
22 kids and see the actual drill meets. So we do not have  
23 that published yet but it is prepared.

24 Wendy Chunn: It is prepared. We're going  
25 to do every two hours. They'll be starting at 8 o'clock

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1 in the morning, so 8-10; 10-12; 12-2; 2-3. The  
2 competition generally is done by 3:00, so at 3:00, we'll  
3 start closing down the concessions. Is that when  
4 they'll do the knockout?

5 SMSgt Quintana: Yes and the awards.

6 Wendy Chunn: Yeah, and the awards. So we  
7 can have everything shut down before they do that.

8 Bill Calihan: Okay. The first crew and the  
9 last crew you can imagine, just helping out with the  
10 set-up and the tear-down/clean up and that regard then  
11 again, we will have just like homecoming, we will have  
12 board members that are floating there as well. Trying  
13 to think if there was anything else for concessions for  
14 that. Any questions?

15 Booster Club Member: I'm coming here to  
16 help out again. I think last year I just kind of came  
17 in here, what do you need.

18 Bill Calihan: Yeah. It was much  
19 appreciated.

20 One of the cadet's families had a question  
21 about the band -- I think there's a band fundraiser also  
22 that same time frame? But I looked into it a little  
23 bit, I guess it's in the evening so if you're part of  
24 the band, please sign up earlier or there are other  
25 opportunities to get involved. So I know that was

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1 initially thought as a conflict, but I didn't really see  
2 much when I looked into it. So we will have, feels like  
3 10, probably 10 booster members so if you could, pass  
4 the word around as well and definitely help out. We're  
5 looking forward to that. It's a lot of fun. I'm not  
6 sure if everyone here has experienced drill, watch  
7 knockout and seeing also some of the -- it's not  
8 freestyle, but some of the.

9 Wendy Chunn: Expedition.

10 Bill Calihan: Pretty amazing as well.

11 Jaremy Daivs: It's amazing. Awesome.

12 Bill Calihan: And then continuing on in  
13 that month, next up we would have the, Jaremy had said  
14 the Seeburger day is the 14th, but also that evening is  
15 the --

16 Jaremy Daivs: Since that's the pot luck,  
17 I'll get a hold of Todd, so let me get a hold of Todd  
18 out at Seeburger's and see what we can't do about,  
19 because I didn't realize it was the pot luck day, on it  
20 so I don't want to compromise, but if he can't, then he  
21 can't, you know, because we've already been working on  
22 it. I'll check with him and we'll let everybody know.

23 Bill Calihan: I love when I come home from  
24 a trip somewhere where they don't have cheeseburgers, I  
25 will go there and have a cheeseburger.

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1                   Jaremy Davis: They're not big on  
2 cheeseburgers in China?

3                   Bill Calihan: Sometimes, not always. Good  
4 to have a homegrown cheeseburger.

5                   So the fall booster club pot luck, this is  
6 really a time we'll use this in place of our, kind of  
7 official meeting, like the one we're having now. Just a  
8 great time to kind of relax, have a little bit more  
9 conversation and community with the cadets and the  
10 families. There will be information that comes out from  
11 the classroom about a dish to pass that's usually  
12 organized by class. We as a booster club we do provide  
13 like, let's say all the cutlery, plates, blah, blah,  
14 blah and we also make sure we get some chicken, just to  
15 make sure there's at least something there as a  
16 backbone, but it's a really good time. We encourage you  
17 as well to come out for that, but we will just take it  
18 easy that night so won't be, we won't be getting into  
19 too much. Because of that with then Thanksgiving and  
20 getting right into December we wanted to make sure that  
21 you are aware that we will send out, likely in early  
22 November, a Sign Up Genius for the Goodfellas newspaper  
23 sales. This is on Saturday, December 2nd and mainly  
24 what it looks like to volunteer for this is to help in  
25 transporting the cadets from location to location.

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1 Sometimes even hopping in the car just to stay warm if  
2 your station is outside of let's say Fields restaurant  
3 and maybe the cadets getting are getting just a little  
4 bit chilly and hop in the car. But roughly, what we  
5 were discussing earlier we figure that's about two to  
6 four volunteers. So again, if you know, November 4 for  
7 drill meet didn't work out this is another opportunity  
8 due to help out and we will get that information out to  
9 you through email, through the Remind and whatnot so.

10 And then the next one, because our booster  
11 meeting towards the end of the month would be Wreaths  
12 across America. Again, information will come out  
13 through the classroom. Volunteers are not required on  
14 that Saturday, obviously, if needed you have to get your  
15 cadet to the cemetery there for the wreath laying.  
16 There is an opportunity that we did identify earlier  
17 this evening in our board meeting, I think it's like 2  
18 to 3 o'clock --

19 SMSgt Quintana: 3 o'clock.

20 Bill Calihan: 3 o'clock on Friday, actually  
21 it's in the --

22 SMSgt Quintana: 15th.

23 Bill Calihan: It should also be in that on  
24 that calendar as well.

25 SMSgt Quintana: We unpack the wreaths that



1 day and lay them out nicely at both the cemeteries.

2 Bill Calihan: So information will be coming  
3 out in that regard, but also it's a great thing for the  
4 cadets to show reverence and kind of understand, let's  
5 say that element of service and those who are in the  
6 community that they are now in.

7 And then finally, we'll be together for our  
8 next booster club meeting on the 19th of December, just  
9 before the Christmas break. Really, probably the main  
10 focus there, we'll definitely recap on all the great  
11 stuff, the results from the previous month and such for  
12 the fundraising or just the events themselves. But we  
13 will be looking ahead to the Toledo drill meet that will  
14 be after the Christmas break on January 6th. So the  
15 volunteer spots for that, we want to just make sure it's  
16 known, understood. And even if you're not volunteering,  
17 this, I know this one is really in Toledo, a lot of  
18 schools come out for that. So that's also a good one to  
19 head down to. I think it's about a little over an hour  
20 drive, a great drill meet. I won't go through all the  
21 future events, but just kind of wanted them on the  
22 agenda so you kind of had, if I can't get plugged in  
23 now, would I want to at some point. You kind of have a  
24 chance to pencil some things in on your own calendar.

25 Before moving out of new business, really

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1 any questions?

2           Booster Club Member: I have one. Which  
3 cemeteries are they putting the wreaths at?

4           SMSgt Quintana: St. Mary's and Oakwood.

5           Jaremy Davis: Okay and then how much time  
6 do you need? So if they volunteer at 3 p.m. on Friday?  
7 About how long?

8           Booster Club Member: Maybe an hour.

9           SMSgt Quintana: More people we have, you  
10 know, 30 minutes to an hour.

11           Booster Club Member: I think we just -- one  
12 year they piled the wreaths up from the back in the  
13 boxes in the trucks and then we drove the trucks up  
14 front and then they just piled them so that took a lot  
15 of time. It was quicker.

16           SMSgt Quintana: It seems like an hour, hour  
17 and a half. But the more people we get, the quicker it  
18 goes. We're just taking all the wreaths from the big  
19 boxes and empty them out and laying them out nicely on  
20 one or two different cemeteries. They usually have them  
21 pre-staged at each of the cemeteries because they know  
22 how many wreaths they have to lay at each of the  
23 cemeteries.

24           Bill Calihan: Thank you for the question.  
25 Irene, correct?

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1           Booster Club Member: No, Lois.

2           Jaremy Davis: You were close.

3           Bill Calihan: Cool. Well, if nothing else,  
4 next section is open discussion. Start with Senior Q's  
5 corner.

6           SMSgt Quintana: I do appreciate all the  
7 support you have all been providing to classroom. The  
8 kids really appreciate it. As far as what's happening  
9 in the future, you know, we have our pictures tomorrow.  
10 So if you have not ordered yet, you can order online.  
11 Ordering online was a little cumbersome, I know, but I  
12 did sent out some instructions, hopefully you guys found  
13 those helpful. If you didn't want to order online, you  
14 can use the hardcopies. I included those in the email  
15 as well. Worst case, send a check with your student and  
16 we'll fill it out here. Everybody will get their  
17 picture taken so we can get them on the classroom  
18 pictures we hang up here. And then so -- like these  
19 guys are talking about, the opportunities to get  
20 involved in the various aspects that we have. Just like  
21 anything else, the cadets see you present, they  
22 appreciate your support. They know that you care so  
23 that goes a long way. Like Mr. Jaremy was talking about  
24 getting to know the cadets, a lot of times you don't get  
25 that opportunity and really talk to some of the cadets.

1 They have really great back stories when get down to it,  
2 getting to know them a little more. As far as community  
3 service opportunities we've done in the past, the  
4 Chesterfield Halloween event, which was this past  
5 Saturday. A little rainy, a little cold, but the kids  
6 prevailed and they made it through and nobody came sick  
7 to school on Monday. That was my biggest fear. I told  
8 them make sure you dress warm and I said if you have  
9 concerns, don't feel like your forced to go. I know it  
10 can be very cold out there. But the previous week we  
11 had the fire station Chesterfield for their open house.  
12 We're doing Feed the Bay on Thursday, that's partially  
13 during school. Some of the kids, there's about 15 kids  
14 that are doing that. Then we pick up the food from the  
15 elementary schools and taking them to the warehouse.  
16 It's a good opportunity for them. We always, they  
17 always provide a pizza party afterwards so it's a nice  
18 thing that the kids can get involved in.

19 We talked about Goodfellas. Goodfellas is  
20 an awesome thing to get involved in. This year we're  
21 going to collect toys for Goodfellas. In years past  
22 we've done Toys for Tots and we never really get to see,  
23 the impact is further away from us. So Goodfellas is a  
24 little bit closer to us so we're going to collect toys  
25 for the month of November for that. And then we'll

1 potentially, because they want some help packing things  
2 up on certain days so we'll see if we can get the kids  
3 released and help them out on that Friday, I think it  
4 is.

5           But as far as the driving support, it's  
6 usually in the morning or the afternoon. It's two  
7 different shifts, it's usually not all day. Usually we  
8 get the kids, get them breakfast in the morning, then  
9 once the shift starts, I think about 8 o'clock we'll  
10 have them all pre-identify and drivers to take them out.  
11 And usually, once you take them out then you're relieved  
12 and then we'll have another group of parents come in the  
13 afternoon time and then the evening to pick them up.  
14 But if there's anybody that's available, keep your phone  
15 because there are times when the kids run out of papers  
16 or if they're getting cold or need to be relieved, we  
17 can do those things.

18           Wreaths across America, again, it's a great  
19 opportunity for you guys to get involved with the cadets  
20 and what they're doing. To see all those things that  
21 they're really paying respect to the veteran's that, you  
22 know, passed away.

23           As far as the drill team, I do encourage you  
24 guys to invite all your families to come because a lot  
25 of times there's not a lot of people in the bleachers.

1 I encourage you to have extended families: Aunts,  
2 cousins and neighbors and everybody you can drag there,  
3 the more support you have, the kids kind of enjoy that  
4 stuff.

5           We have our Halloween party coming up on the  
6 27th of October for the kids and then we'll have our  
7 Christmas party in December. Don't really have a date  
8 for that. We just kind of hammered out our trip. I  
9 talked about, told the kids today, we always revolve  
10 that around a drill meet. In Dayton, Ohio, they have  
11 the Air Force Nationals there. I think it's really  
12 going to be a great opportunity for the kids to go to be  
13 able to be a part of it, the nationals, and see all the  
14 other schools that are going to compete. So a lot of  
15 schools come. They get a lot of toys, trinkets,  
16 T-shirt, they get a nice photograph. It's going to be  
17 some memories they can take back home with them. But in  
18 conjunction, we're going to go down to Nashville. It's  
19 a five day trip. We'll leave on Friday, come back on  
20 Tuesday. In Dayton, we'll see the Armstrong Space  
21 Museum, go to the Air Force Museum. Nashville, see some  
22 things down there. Of course we got to hit Buccees on  
23 the way down so. I didn't realize the kids were going  
24 to get that excited, but hey, you know what, maybe we  
25 can give our mascot here some buddies to hang out with.

1 I don't want have all of the costs at this point we're  
2 just trying to pricings for coach buses and hotels and  
3 stuff like that. Once I get all the prices out, I'll  
4 let you guys know how much that will be for each cadet  
5 so based on funding that I'm going to get from either  
6 the different sources of Air Force and ROTC and all that  
7 stuff so.

8                   But, again, I appreciate you guys coming.  
9 We haven't had this many people in a booster club  
10 meetings for a while. Must be my new hair cut that  
11 brought you all here. We appreciate you guys. Right.  
12 Thanks for supporting us.

13                   Bill Calihan: Thank you, Senior Q.  
14 Awesome. All right. And then next we have Corp  
15 Commander Corner.

16                   Corp Commander Rachow: Hi. In case you  
17 don't know me, I am Lieutenant, Cadet Lieutenant Colonel  
18 Logan Rachow. I am the Cadet Corp Commander for this  
19 year. First like to start off by saying that cadet side  
20 we appreciate everything you guys have been doing for  
21 us. I know it hasn't -- we appreciate all the support  
22 you've been giving us. I think I touched on this a  
23 little bit last week, or last month, but we really do --  
24 everything you do for us, we do take it to heart,  
25 personally. We don't always show it, but we always

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1 really do appreciate you guys putting in time. You guys  
2 coming to field trips with us. We really do appreciate  
3 that stuff. Other than that, Senior Q. mentioned that  
4 there's cadet photos tomorrow so please have your cadets  
5 wear their full service dress. In case you don't know  
6 what that is, that is your blue service or your blue  
7 dress pants and your blue under shirt and your blue  
8 service coat. Service coat is the one with the three  
9 buttons, the big brass buttons, tie/tie tab. We want to  
10 make sure, make sure everyone's uniform looks nice. So  
11 please remind your cadets, full service dress for  
12 tomorrow.

13                   This Friday is our PT test, our first one so  
14 please have your cadets dress appropriately for that,  
15 too. It's going to push ups, sit-ups and a run, so  
16 please don't have them come in school crocs or boots or  
17 anything like that. We want to make sure that they're  
18 in appropriate attire for the PT test.

19                   Our drill meet's on November 4, they  
20 mentioned that a little bit. Please come and show up.  
21 Makes it a lot more fun for us participating in the  
22 drill meet when we see there's full crowds and that,  
23 kind of a morale boost. So the more people in the  
24 crowds, the better we end up feeling. It just makes the  
25 whole event that much better when we got full crowds and



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1 they're cheering for all of us. It just makes it that  
2 much better. That is all -- one of three mandatory  
3 events for cadets to go to. There are sign-up sheets  
4 for cadets over there, but there's two different shifts.  
5 There's morning shift and an afternoon shift. At least  
6 one shift is mandatory per cadet. I think they are only  
7 like four or five hour long shifts so please motivate  
8 them to do that. If don't have them at home just all  
9 day. We need cadets there cause it shows our school  
10 spirit and it shows our unit, personally, because I  
11 think there's going to be like five, six other schools  
12 there so please have them come. With that, then similar  
13 to what they said, parent volunteers, besides us, not  
14 just in the crowds but we also do appreciate you guys  
15 helping us with the concessions and all the other, like,  
16 service stuff that you guys do for us. So between that  
17 and the, just going to show up to support us. That's a  
18 lot for us and we really do appreciate that. I think  
19 that's all I really have. If you have any questions  
20 I'll be more than happy to answer them.

21 I think that's all I have.

22 Bill Calihan: How about we do the drawing?

23 Corp Commander Rachow: Knupp. Winner of the  
24 drawing.

25 Bill Calihan: Let's see what the big prize

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1 is. What's the swag today?

2 Corp Commander Rachow: You got a stack of  
3 ROTC cups, U.S. Air Force T-shirt and Air Force lanyard.

4 Bill Calihan: Awesome. So if you're online  
5 still with us, come on in next time and give a crack at  
6 the door prize.

7 Our last section here, open --

8 SMSgt Quintana: Can I say something, here,  
9 I forgot? I was thinking about, so we're having there's  
10 a veteran's day event that they're going to have at the  
11 Shoreliner and so they'll be inviting veteran's to have  
12 lunch and stuff like that. What we're going to be doing  
13 this year is I invited our Corp Commander and our  
14 Director of Operations and our Kitty Hawk Commander to  
15 give a short speech about Veteran's Day and kind of what  
16 it means. We want to get the perspective from the  
17 student's point of view and so a lot of what I do is, if  
18 you're paying attention, because this is a cadet-led  
19 program, so I really want to try to get the kids out  
20 there as much as I possibly can. So it's customary to  
21 give a speech along with the mayor and all the other big  
22 wigs out there, right? So it's just giving them the  
23 opportunity to get themselves out there and show the  
24 public what we're doing in the program in regards to the  
25 cadet leadership. You'll see the same things at the

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1 drill meets. You'll see the same things that the  
2 military ball where I let these guys kind of run the  
3 thing and they're running the operations and so you guys  
4 will see those things as the cadets lead the programs.  
5 Sure, I'm here to oversee things, make sure nobody's  
6 getting in trouble, but for the most part we're trying  
7 to get the kids out there as much as possible. So  
8 hopefully you guys will see that and appreciate those  
9 things that we're doing in this program so I just wanted  
10 to mention that.

11 Bill Calihan: Thank you. That's awesome.  
12 The Shoreliner event, is that open to everyone or is  
13 that just with the school?

14 SMSgt Quintana: As far as I know, it's  
15 anyone, as far as veteran, it's going to be on that  
16 Thursday before Veteran's Day, so the 9th, I think it  
17 is.

18 Bill Calihan: And information will come out  
19 through the --

20 SMSgt Quintana: Through the school.

21 Jaremy Davis: I think if you go to the  
22 school website, I think there's information on it.

23 Bill Calihan: Excellent.

24 SMSgt Quintana: Just wanted to put that  
25 plug so these guys will be out there.

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1           Jaremy Davis: And then there's rumor next  
2 month, especially for those watching that didn't show  
3 up, that there might be gift cards for our prizes next  
4 month. Door prizes.

5           Bill Calihan: You're in the community.  
6 Excellent. Grabbing up those donations. But, cool.

7           Well, speaking of community, and just our  
8 closing area in open discussion, public comments,  
9 general membership topics or motions, if there's  
10 anything out there that you all had, and even a chance  
11 to ask questions about anything you heard today or  
12 didn't hear today and still had a question, the floor is  
13 really yours.

14           Booster Club Member: Is there anything  
15 needed for the Halloween party? Donations or anything?

16           SMSgt Quintana: No, not really because the  
17 kids, again, it's kind of like the pot luck, based on  
18 the grade levels they'll bring in snacks and drinks and  
19 stuff like that.

20           Jaremy Davis: Don't everybody ask at once.

21           (No response.)

22           Bill Calihan: Well, thank you, again. I'll  
23 maybe ask the board here to present a motion to adjourn?

24           Jaremy Davis: I make a motion we adjourn.

25           Larry Rachow: I second.

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1                   Jaremy Davis:   Sounds like a plan.

2                   Bill Calihan:   All right.   Meeting

3   adjourned.
