Tuesday, 17 October 172023.
Call to order at 7:04 p.m.

Bill Calihan: So welcome everybody. Thanks again for coming out to the second booster club meeting of the year for the ROTC and our cadets here. First, I just want to say thank you to the Davis family, again $I$ mentioned it, providing the refreshments so sorry we couldn't catch you at home and or online watch us at a later time frame. Stop in and see us and partake at some point in the school year, hopefully, and again back by popular demand, we have the door prize so hopefully everybody's signed in. There will be some, a drawing that Cadet Rachow will take us through. But I would like to start, as it was well received this year by the first meeting, the Pledge of Allegiance so if everyone could join me in standing. Please jump in after I get this started.
(Pledge of Allegiance was recited.)
Bill Calihan: All right. So now that we're into the second board meeting, we do have our meeting minutes from the previous month. We were not able to get a copy to all of you today, but we will. That will be the regular order of business as the year proceeds. We will have the minutes posted to the Weebly, as well.

We met together previously on September 19th and some of the highlights from there $I$ went over the absence of our Treasurer Larry Rachow. I went over the Treasurer's report, highlighting a few of the items that were in there. That report was also passed out at the booster club meeting there and the income and expenses were addressed. There were only a few that month.

Special events and fundraising: This was taken by Jaremy Davis to my left here, our fundraising chair and also Sergeant Master Quintana. The first special event we had was Friday, September 22. Many of your cadets had been in the ropes course and then we also did the, we were getting ready for our fall fundraiser for the candy bars and then we had also the homecoming concessions. The old business from the 19th of September was that the bylaws for the booster club, so for the Board up here, but then also all of you as making the, completing the booster club those are posted and linked on the Weebly for your information. And then in new business, the main part of our new business was going through the year, calendar, just trying to help promote all the areas where you can get plugged in with the, as the booster club to come alongside the classroom, hel either to raise money or support at events where
supervision or just support is let's say needed. Okay. And then we had an open discussion that kind of addressed how the overall function and finances worked and we adjourned around 1940 .

Any comments or anything needed to be added?
Okay. All right.
(No response.)
Bill Calihan: Then can we go for a vote to close those and post them?

Wendy Chunn: Yes. Bill.
Bill Calihan: Approve.
Wendy Chunn: Jaremy.
Jaremy Davis: Yes, approved.
Wendy Chunn: Larry.
Larry Rachow: Approved.
Wendy Chunn: And, Wendy. I approve.
Bill Calihan: All right. Thank you.
So moving on for the month of October now with September closed out. We're going to start with the Treasurer's report. Should have all had a chance to grab a handout on the way in.

Larry Rachow: Closing out September starting out the year, not much coming on the revenue side. We're still pretty strong at just over $\$ 17,000$ in the account. So as you can see there's really no
revenue coming in for the month of September. I know we talked about homecoming, but that was in October so we'll record that next month. Towards the end I'll give a little summary of that, the original numbers coming in. Then if we flip over to the expenses. If we, a lot of the set up, the cadets with their uniform were in there. The big thing that Bill said earlier, the ropes course, the field trip, all the expenses for food and drink for the cadets.

Other than that, just got a couple pending items, one from last year, one of the scholarships and a couple of the supplies and uniform alterations. Then hitting on the homecoming, roughly, if you look at it we've got the reimbursement from the school of $\$ 2,000$. The concession sales were just over $\$ 300$ and then we spent about $\$ 1,200$ in concessions to support that so we made about $\$ 1,300$ in concessions, but the true numbers will come out once everything starts to clear for next year -- next month, not next year. Thank you.

Bill Calihan: Any questions?
(No verbal response.)
Bill Calihan: We'll go over to Jaremy for the fundraising reports.

Jaremy Davis: All right. So like Larry had mentioned, we had had the homecoming concessions and
we'll have the final numbers for everybody at next month's meeting or actually, probably at December's meeting to be honest because we're not going to have any numbers for the pot luck. Because we got the pot luck in November and we'll go through that. We did so appreciate everybody that helped out with the homecoming concessions. It actually is pretty fun working with the kids and stuff too so if you guys have a chance to help out with concessions, do it because you can have a lot of fun. It's not as stressful and strenuous, the kids, the cadets do a wonderful job at really assisting and helping out and doing the running and a lot of the heavy lifting and so $I$ just got a chance to, when $I$ was there helping to, you know, mess with the kids a little bit. So, you know, that's always fun. I appreciate all the parents that helped out and volunteered for that.

The candy bars, as of yesterday, we had 35 boxes that were left so we have a few less than that today.

SMSgt Quintana: About a dozen left. Jaremy Davis: About a dozen left? So there you go.

Bill Calihan: What did we start with? SMSgt Quintana: 162. This year is going really, really well. Really quick.

Jaremy Davis: So the candy bar sales are going very well. Right? I know. You ain't kidding. The wafer ones are phenomenal. So that's great and probably by tomorrow most of those will be out the door because the cadets will be picking them up. So we appreciate everybody that's eating candy and has bought and sold them. So thank you so much.

Restaurants for the month for this fall. Last night we had the Pit Stop diner and thank you for everybody that had an opportunity or chance to get out. Did -- was anybody able to go out last night to the Pit Stop? Excellent. And how was everything? Good.

I love Audra in the Pit Stop and I
appreciate their willingness to help support us so if you guys get a chance, make sure you go there and tell her and the staff thanks for helping support us the next time you're in. They do a tremendous job and so I appreciate that.

Next month, second Tuesday which is, I foget the day, Seeburger's Cheeseburgers. Todd, also a very awesome guy for the community, always willing to help out. That will be on the second Tuesday of November and on still finalizing the December, but I'll let everybody know, obviously, at the pot luck, that the December one is. But make sure that we also get out and support

Seeburger's Cheeseburgers on the second Tuesday because, and the great thing about Todd, is some of these places like Texas Roadhouse, you got to make sure you have the flyer and you got to bring it in and you got to present it ahead of time and all that stuff. We appreciate everybody helping out. Todd makes it very easy. He doesn't even care if you come in and say JROTC, although it would be great if you did that way he knows who's coming in for that. Todd's just willing to donate to us, you know, based off of his sales and stuff for that day so make sure you get out and you support Seeburger's Cheeseburgers on the second Tuesday of November.

Bill Calihan: So do you have a conflict? I just realized, that's the 14 th.

Booster Club Member: It's the booster club meeting. Is there a time frame? Jaremy Davis: All day. All day long. So it's --

Bill Calihan: Go get your lunch, ROTC. Jaremy Davis: Grab some dinner before you come and there you go.

Booster Club Member: Can we just bring the carry out and cheeseburgers and bring --

Bill Calihan: I'm coming to you're -- dish you're passing.

Booster Club Member: Carry out. Take it
home. Come to the meeting.
Jaremy Davis: Yeah, absolutely. If you guys, $I$ don't know who hasn't been to Seeburger's Cheeseburgers? The most incredible onion rings that you'll ever have in your entire life. They're as big as your head. They're awesome. And, not to mention, the Fat Gratiot, which I really shouldn't eat any more, but the Fat Gratiot, the hamburger he's got is my favorite. So Seeburger's Cheeseburgers. Great place. Chicken sandwiches, chili, hamburgers. It's all fresh. So any ways, that's -- was there anything else I missed? I don't think so.

Bill Calihan: No. Fantastic.
Jaremy Davis: But I appreciate everybody's help and support. It really does help out and if anybody has, like I sad last month, if you have anybody, if anybody knows of a restaurant of the month or that might want to donate, $I$ have talked to for this spring coming up, just so everybody knows, I did talk to Bubba's Barbecue and talked to Steve, from Bubba's Barbecue, he runs the food truck, has a food truck and so we're going to be working with him coming up this spring. I just talked to him the other day so I actually haven't filled anybody else in.

Bill Calihan: Awesome.

Booster Club Member: Buffalo Wild Wings does them and I think Olive Garden -- not Olive Garden, Olga's does them, too.

Jaremy Davis: Oh, okay.
Booster Club Member: I've been to other ones for Anchor Bay.

Jaremy Davis: Excellent. I appreciate
that. And BDubs did help us out by donating stuff to the raffle last year so they are a good place. I appreciate that.

Bill Calihan: Thank you. What was your name?

Stephanie: Stephanie.
Bill Calihan: Stephanie. Awesome. If you have also another idea or something like Stephanie, but you didn't think of it now, we try to keep it, all the ways to get in contact with us on the footer of the agenda when it comes in. There's a whole lot of information in there. Also, one thing that really helps me out, the something let's say you have a smart phone with a calendar on it, that bottom line, subscribe to our calendar. You can go into your phone calendar and subscribe to a, I guess it's called like a feed or something, but, basically, should be pretty straight
forward to do and you can get all the ROTC dates right there on your smart phone and see when those good restaurants of month that's coming up. So can at least plug that.

Jaremy Davis: And then if you guys ever are wondering, $I$ always try, Senior Q. always puts, not to mention an event page for facebook for restaurant of the month and then and so you guys can share it, even if you're not able to make it, if you guys share it and you make it public when you share it that's great because that's more eyes that get to it. But then also if you, I also share it pretty heavily on mine and $I$ always tag the JROTC in it so if you look up on facebook, the JROTC, Anchor Bay ROTC, you'll see a tag or whatever if you do a search on it and then you'll be able to see what the different restaurants of month and stuff are as well as we advertise.

Booster Club Member: I like that you do the event because it pops up on my phone, you forget.

Jaremy Davis: Agreed. So that's all I got. Sorry.

Bill Calihan: No, it's perfect. No worries. Good.

Next topic on our agenda is just the old business, just to kind of capture there was something.

Basically, what we did last month was mainly review the yearly calendar and then really kind of playing out that theme, stepping into the new business, but we really want to be intentional about this year at the Booster Club meetings is just kind of letting you know, hey, what's coming up, event-wise and kind of getting into a little bit more detail. How you can get involved. How you can help out. What that also looks like and so we'll dive into that now and in the first part of the new business would be, in that same line, would be the drill meet concessions. We do have the home drill meet. It's coming up on November 4th and there's quite a bit of activity that's happening that day. A lot of it's covered through the classroom or the Board. One area that we definitely need booster club support on is in the concessions. So what we do is we partner with the sports boosters and we get access to the concession stand that's normally used when there's an event in the gym and then we kind of come in there. We have to put, let's say, put all their stuff away if anything is still left out and then we bring our own concession material in and we go ahead and use it, use that space to make coffee. We make hot water for Ramen. I'm pretty sure we cooked hot dogs last year and some other things. We talked about, we'll have to see how it works out in the
concession. Purchasing, but also maybe getting the popcorn going as well. So essentially what we're looking for is two booster club volunteers per time slot. We'll dive into what that looks like in just a moment, and then Senior Q. within the classroom, he will organize with the cadets, to ensure there's probably, I would say, three to four cadets that are helping to run orders between the side room and the front where the booster club members are taking the cash and working on the, we have, like, a machine for the credit cards and such. So it really helps out a lot in that regard. That's fun, like Jaremy said, getting a chance to kind of see the character and can-do attitude of the cadets in between the drill meets and whatnot. And then, yeah, we will have also booster club members, let's say, as well there, kind of floating as well as, so if you volunteer and you're like, wait a minute, my son or daughter is in a drill at this time, because $I$ think a lot of the schedules come out very close to that time frame. I recall in the past years, working together to make sure that each parent was able to go and see their kids and see the actual drill meets. So we do not have that published yet but it is prepared.

Wendy Chunn: It is prepared. We're going to do every two hours. They'll be starting at 8 o'clock
in the morning, so 8-10; 10-12; 12-2; 2-3. The competition generally is done by 3:00, so at 3:00, we'll start closing down the concessions. Is that when they'll do the knockout?

SMSgt Quintana: Yes and the awards.
Wendy Chunn: Yeah, and the awards. So we can have everything shut down before they do that.

Bill Calihan: Okay. The first crew and the last crew you can imagine, just helping out with the set-up and the tear-down/clean up and that regard then again, we will have just like homecoming, we will have board members that are floating there as well. Trying to think if there was anything else for concessions for that. Any questions?

Booster Club Member: I'm coming here to help out again. I think last year I just kind of came in here, what do you need.

Bill Calihan: Yeah. It was much appreciated.

One of the cadet's families had a question about the band -- I think there's a band fundraiser also that same time frame? But I looked into it a little bit, $I$ guess it's in the evening so if you're part of the band, please sign up earlier or there are other opportunities to get involved. So I know that was
initially thought as a conflict, but $I$ didn't really see much when $I$ looked into it. So we will have, feels like 10, probably 10 booster members so if you could, pass the word around as well and definitely help out. We're looking forward to that. It's a lot of fun. I'm not sure if everyone here has experienced drill, watch knockout and seeing also some of the -- it's not freestyle, but some of the.

Wendy Chunn: Expedition. Bill Calihan: Pretty amazing as well. Jaremy Daivs: It's amazing. Awesome. Bill Calihan: And then continuing on in that month, next up we would have the, Jaremy had said the Seeburger day is the 14 th, but also that evening is the --

Jaremy Daivs: Since that's the pot luck, I'll get a hold of Todd, so let me get a hold of Todd out at Seeburger's and see what we can't do about, because I didn't realize it was the pot luck day, on it so I don't want to compromise, but if he can't, then he can't, you know, because we've already been working on it. I'll check with him and we'll let everybody know. Bill Calihan: I love when $I$ come home from a trip somewhere where they don't have cheeseburgers, I will go there and have a cheeseburger.

Jaremy Davis: They're not big on cheeseburgers in China?

Bill Calihan: Sometimes, not always. Good to have a homegrown cheeseburger.

So the fall booster club pot luck, this is really a time we'll use this in place of our, kind of official meeting, like the one we're having now. Just a great time to kind of relax, have a little bit more conversation and community with the cadets and the families. There will be information that comes out from the classroom about a dish to pass that's usually organized by class. We as a booster club we do provide like, let's say all the cutlery, plates, blah, blah, blah and we also make sure we get some chicken, just to make sure there's at least something there as a backbone, but it's a really good time. We encourage you as well to come out for that, but we will just take it easy that night so won't be, we won't be getting into too much. Because of that with then Thanksgiving and getting right into December we wanted to make sure that you are aware that we will send out, likely in early November, a Sign Up Genius for the Goodfellas newspaper sales. This is on Saturday, December $2 n d$ and mainly what it looks like to volunteer for this is to help in transporting the cadets from location to location.

Sometimes even hopping in the car just to stay warm if your station is outside of let's say Fields restaurant and maybe the cadets getting are getting just a little bit chilly and hop in the car. But roughly, what we were discussing earlier we figure that's about two to four volunteers. So again, if you know, November 4 for drill meet didn't work out this is another opportunity due to help out and we will get that information out to you through email, through the Remind and whatnot so. And then the next one, because our booster meeting towards the end of the month would be Wreaths across America. Again, information will come out through the classroom. Volunteers are not required on that Saturday, obviously, if needed you have to get your cadet to the cemetery there for the wreath laying. There is an opportunity that we did identify earlier this evening in our board meeting, I think it's like 2 to 3 o'clock --

SMSgt Quintana: 3 o'clock. Bill Calihan: 3 o'clock on Friday, actually it's in the -SMSgt Quintana: 15th. Bill Calihan: It should also be in that on that calendar as well.

SMSgt Quintana: We unpack the wreaths that
day and lay them out nicely at both the cemeteries.
Bill Calihan: So information will be coming out in that regard, but also it's a great thing for the cadets to show reverence and kind of understand, let's say that element of service and those who are in the community that they are now in.

And then finally, we'll be together for our next booster club meeting on the 19th of December, just before the Christmas break. Really, probably the main focus there, we'll definitely recap on all the great stuff, the results from the previous month and such for the fundraising or just the events themselves. But we will be looking ahead to the Toledo drill meet that will be after the Christmas break on January 6th. So the volunteer spots for that, we want to just make sure it's known, understood. And even if you're not volunteering, this, $I$ know this one is really in Toledo, a lot of schools come out for that. So that's also a good one to head down to. I think it's about a little over an hour drive, a great drill meet. I won't go through all the future events, but just kind of wanted them on the agenda so you kind of had, if $I$ can't get plugged in now, would $I$ want to at some point. You kind of have a chance to pencil some things in on your own calendar.
Before moving out of new business, really
any questions?
Booster Club Member: I have one. Which cemeteries are they putting the wreaths at?

SMSgt Quintana: St. Mary's and Oakwood.
Jaremy Davis: Okay and then how much time do you need? So if they volunteer at 3 p.m. on Friday? About how long?

Booster Club Member: Maybe an hour.
SMSgt Quintana: More people we have, you know, 30 minutes to an hour.

Booster Club Member: I think we just -- one year they piled the wreaths up from the back in the boxes in the trucks and then we drove the trucks up front and then they just piled them so that took a lot of time. It was quicker.

SMSgt Quintana: It seems like an hour, hour and a half. But the more people we get, the quicker it goes. We're just taking all the wreaths from the big boxes and empty them out and laying them out nicely on one or two different cemeteries. They usually have them pre-staged at each of the cemeteries because they know how many wreaths they have to lay at each of the cemeteries.

Bill Calihan: Thank you for the question. Irene, correct?

Booster Club Member: No, Lois. Jaremy Davis: You were close.

Bill Calihan: Cool. Well, if nothing else, next section is open discussion. Start with Senior Q's corner.

SMSgt Quintana: I do appreciate all the support you have all been providing to classroom. The kids really appreciate it. As far as what's happening in the future, you know, we have our pictures tomorrow. So if you have not ordered yet, you can order online. Ordering online was a little cumbersome, $I$ know, but I did sent out some instructions, hopefully you guys found those helpful. If you didn't want to order online, you can use the hardcopies. I included those in the email as well. Worst case, send a check with your student and we'll fill it out here. Everybody will get their picture taken so we can get them on the classroom pictures we hang up here. And then so -- like these guys are talking about, the opportunities to get involved in the various aspects that we have. Just like anything else, the cadets see you present, they appreciate your support. They know that you care so that goes a long way. Like Mr. Jaremy was talking about getting to know the cadets, a lot of times you don't get that opportunity and really talk to some of the cadets.

They have really great back stories when get down to it, getting to know them a little more. As far as community service opportunities we've done in the past, the Chesterfield Halloween event, which was this past Saturday. A little rainy, a little cold, but the kids prevailed and they made it through and nobody came sick to school on Monday. That was my biggest fear. I told them make sure you dress warm and I said if you have concerns, don't feel like your forced to go. I know it can be very cold out there. But the previous week we had the fire station Chesterfield for their open house. We're doing Feed the Bay on Thursday, that's partially during school. Some of the kids, there's about 15 kids that are doing that. Then we pick up the food from the elementary schools and taking them to the warehouse. It's a good opportunity for them. We always, they always provide a pizza party afterwards so it's a nice thing that the kids can get involved in.

We talked about Goodfellas. Goodfellas is an awesome thing to get involved in. This year we're going to collect toys for Goodfellas. In years past we've done Toys for Tots and we never really get to see, the impact is further away from us. So Goodfellas is a little bit closer to us so we're going to collect toys for the month of November for that. And then we'll
potentially, because they want some help packing things up on certain days so we'll see if we can get the kids released and help them out on that Friday, I think it is.

But as far as the driving support, it's usually in the morning or the afternoon. It's two different shifts, it's usually not all day. Usually we get the kids, get them breakfast in the morning, then once the shift starts, $I$ think about 8 o'clock we'll have them all pre-identify and drivers to take them out. And usually, once you take them out then you're relieved and then we'll have another group of parents come in the afternoon time and then the evening to pick them up. But if there's anybody that's available, keep your phone because there are times when the kids run out of papers or if they're getting cold or need to be relieved, we can do those things.

Wreaths across America, again, it's a great opportunity for you guys to get involved with the cadets and what they're doing. To see all those things that they're really paying respect to the veteran's that, you know, passed away.

As far as the drill team, $I$ do encourage you guys to invite all your families to come because a lot of times there's not a lot of people in the bleachers.

I encourage you to have extended families: Aunts, cousins and neighbors and everybody you can drag there, the more support you have, the kids kind of enjoy that stuff.

We have our Halloween party coming up on the $27 t h$ of October for the kids and then we'll have our Christmas party in December. Don't really have a date for that. We just kind of hammered out our trip. I talked about, told the kids today, we always revolve that around a drill meet. In Dayton, Ohio, they have the Air Force Nationals there. I think it's really going to be a great opportunity for the kids to go to be able to be a part of it, the nationals, and see all the other schools that are going to compete. So a lot of schools come. They get a lot of toys, trinkets, T-shirt, they get a nice photograph. It's going to be some memories they can take back home with them. But in conjunction, we're going to go down to Nashville. It's a five day trip. We'll leave on Friday, come back on Tuesday. In Dayton, we'll see the Armstrong Space Museum, go to the Air Force Museum. Nashville, see some things down there. Of course we got to hit Buccees on the way down so. I didn't realize the kids were going to get that excited, but hey, you know what, maybe we can give our mascot here some buddies to hang out with.

I don't want have all of the costs at this point we're just trying to pricings for coach buses and hotels and stuff like that. Once I get all the prices out, I'll let you guys know how much that will be for each cadet so based on funding that $I$ 'm going to get from either the different sources of Air Force and ROTC and all that stuff so.

But, again, I appreciate you guys coming. We haven't had this many people in a booster club meetings for a while. Must be my new hair cut that brought you all here. We appreciate you guys. Right. Thanks for supporting us.

Bill Calihan: Thank you, Senior $Q$. Awesome. All right. And then next we have Corp Commander Corner.

Corp Commander Rachow: Hi. In case you don't know me, I am Lieutenant, Cadet Lieutenant Colonel Logan Rachow. I am the Cadet Corp Commander for this year. First like to start off by saying that cadet side we appreciate everything you guys have been doing for us. I know it hasn't -- we appreciate all the support you've been giving us. I think I touched on this a little bit last week, or last month, but we really do -everything you do for us, we do take it to heart, personally. We don't always show it, but we always
really do appreciate you guys putting in time. You guys coming to field trips with us. We really do appreciate that stuff. Other than that, Senior Q. mentioned that there's cadet photos tomorrow so please have your cadets wear their full service dress. In case you don't know what that is, that is your blue service or your blue dress pants and your blue under shirt and your blue service coat. Service coat is the one with the three buttons, the big brass buttons, tie/tie tab. We want to make sure, make sure everyone's uniform looks nice. So please remind your cadets, full service dress for tomorrow.

This Friday is our PT test, our first one so please have your cadets dress appropriately for that, too. It's going to push ups, sit-ups and a run, so please don't have them come in school crocs or boots or anything like that. We want to make sure that they're in appropriate attire for the PT test.

Our drill meet's on November 4, they mentioned that a little bit. Please come and show up. Makes it a lot more fun for us participating in the drill meet when we see there's full crowds and that, kind of a morale boost. So the more people in the crowds, the better we end up feeling. It just makes the whole event that much better when we got full crowds and
they're cheering for all of us. It just makes it that much better. That is all -- one of three mandatory events for cadets to go to. There are sign-up sheets for cadets over there, but there's two different shifts. There's morning shift and an afternoon shift. At least one shift is mandatory per cadet. I think they are only like four or five hour long shifts so please motivate them to do that. If don't have them at home just all day. We need cadets there cause it shows our school spirit and it shows our unit, personally, because I think there's going to be like five, six other schools there so please have them come. With that, then similar to what they said, parent volunteers, besides us, not just in the crowds but we also do appreciate you guys helping us with the concessions and all the other, like, service stuff that you guys do for us. So between that and the, just going to show up to support us. That's a lot for us and we really do appreciate that. I think that's all I really have. If you have any questions I'll be more than happy to answer them.

I think that's all $I$ have.
Bill Calihan: How about we do the drawing? Corp Commander Rachow: Knupp. Winner of the drawing.

Bill Calihan: Let's see what the big prize
is. What's the swag today?

Corp Commander Rachow: You got a stack of ROTC cups, U.S. Air Force T-shirt and Air Force lanyard. Bill Calihan: Awesome. So if you're online still with us, come on in next time and give a crack at the door prize.

Our last section here, open --
SMSgt Quintana: Can $I$ say something, here, I forgot? I was thinking about, so we're having there's a veteran's day event that they're going to have at the Shoreliner and so they'll be inviting veteran's to have lunch and stuff like that. What we're going to be doing this year is $I$ invited our Corp Commander and our Director of Operations and our Kitty Hawk Commander tov give a short speech about Veteran's Day and kind of what it means. We want to get the perspective from the student's point of view and so a lot of what $I$ do is, if you're paying attention, because this is a cadet-led program, so I really want to try to get the kids out there as much as $I$ possibly can. So it's customary to give a speech along with the mayor and all the other big wigs out there, right? So it's just giving them the opportunity to get themselves out there and show the public what we're doing in the program in regards to the cadet leadership. You'll see the same things at the
drill meets.
